

She has published numerous scientific paper and lives with her husband on Bainbridge Island, Washington. *Deep Waters* is Mathews's first book.

## Interview Questions

- 1. Can you tell us briefly what your book is about?
- 2. You use the term "relationship resilience." Can you say more about what that means to you and how it relates to your story?
- 3. What challenges, beyond the immediate medical crisis for your husband, did your family face?
- 4. Can you tell us why a sailing trip put your husband at greater risk? What other things put him at risk during his recuperation?
- 5. How was sailing healing for your husband? Was it also for you and your son?
- 6. Three times during *Deep Waters* you almost lose your husband, twice while in remote locations while on your family's sailboat. Your 9-year-old son is by your side as you navigate each crisis. How do account for his maturity and how he rose to each occasion? Do you still sail?
- 7. A key part to *Deep Waters* is adventure. Can you share a highlight from the sailing trips you took in Southeast Alaska?
- 8. During your career at the university, you taught marine biology and published scientific papers, and now you're a writer. What was the biggest challenge in transitioning from writing scientific papers to writing a compelling memoir? How long did it take you to write *Deep Waters?* Do you plan another book?
- 9. What do you hope readers will take away from reading your memoir?
- 10. This memoir is about a lot of things, and one of them is Alaska. Is this, in a way, a love letter to Alaska?



## From DEEP WATERS

"Hey, Beth." David got my attention from the hallway. "I need to talk to you—in private." He gestured away from the glass-enclosed station. We stood face to face. His eyes drew me in. "You know, Bartlett's a great hospital." He stroked his goatee. "I love my job. Everyone works hard. They're good at what they do." His face tensed. "But this situation is serious. We're a small county hospital. Jim needs experts, and he needs them now."

I took in each word, absorbing the weight of their truth.

"You've got to get him out of here—to Anchorage or Seattle. That'll only happen if you're firm with his doctor. When she gets here, you have to insist he's medevacked to a bigger hospital."

My breaths became labored as if I'd broken the surface after a long dive.

He continued. "There's this odd situation between the insurance and doctors. It costs a lot to evacuate someone out of Juneau. The docs are under pressure from insurance companies to keep patients here. Your nature is to be agreeable, but you need to do this. For Jim. You've got to insist he gets on that Learjet and taken to a larger center. You'll be doing your doctor a favor. If you don't push this, she'll be reluctant to order it. If you do, she'll have to try."

Juneau was surrounded by mountains, glaciers, and ocean with no roads out—no big medical centers nearby. Since we'd arrived at Bartlett, I'd passed the responsibility baton off to the medical team. I'd relinquished my decision-making role, expecting them to do what was best for my husband. But now our friend was telling me to step forward, take command, steer this crisis down a different path.

David glanced at his watch. "I've got to get back to my office. If you have any problems, call me." He placed his business card in my palm.

Thank you." I hugged him hard. Taught to respect authority, politely follow the advice of professionals, my pulse quickened with dread.

"The other thing." He glanced over his shoulder. "There's one medevac jet for all of Alaska. It goes back and forth. You need to get on their list right away. If another, more critical, emergency comes up, they'll bump him. And, I don't know if the plane is in Seattle, or Anchorage, or here."

Hand trembling, I dialed the clinic operator.
